COMMUNITY HERITAGE GRANT

We are very fortunate to have been successful with our grant application submitted to the National Library of Australia (NLA) for funding to conduct a significant workshop in the new year. As it was also the first time we have received Federal funding through the Community Heritage Grants program, we were invited to send a representative to Canberra to participate in a 2.5 days workshop providing insight into the operations of NLA, and how to care for cultural collections with guidance from National Museum of Australia, National Archives of Australia (NAA) and National Film and Sound Archive.

I had the pleasure of attending with 44 others from all over Australia including the Tiwi Islands, looking after a variety of collections such as musical scores, Indigenous artwork, over 30 years of documents fighting for Indigenous rights and memorabilia from renowned artists Hans Heysen and Nora Heysen being cared for by great grand daughter and great niece, Rosemary Heysen. Most stayed at the Pavilion Hotel, near the Information Centre if you know Canberra. A presentation ceremony was held when the director of the National Museum of Australia, Andrew Sayers, presented certificates acknowledging the grants. I was later given a certificate recognising my participation in the workshop.

Information of use to us:

1. Store all 8mm film etc in individual canisters and not paper-based boxes the film may have originally been supplied in.

2. Off the shelf products considered useful for storing objects and archives are tested by NAA for their suitability and results posted on their website. Glad bags have their tick of approval.

3. When converting recordings of any sort into new and useful media, always keep the original in your archives. Future development in technology always has the potential of providing a convenient means of use for them again.

4. TROVE are looking to the public to add to the collection.

5. The various institutions are always willing to help and encourage queries be emailed to them.

We were privileged to see the new Treasures Gallery only recently opened by NLA, who are extremely proud of being a library with permanent display space. The highlight was seeing the Endeavour's journal. Spending time admiring this wondrous document, I began reading aloud a couple of lines of the text attracting an interested audience.

I spent my last afternoon in Canberra at the library researching ephemera and a book they hold relevant to Altona. The ephemera included three early twentieth century land sales posters I've purchased copies of. The book, The History of Williamstown by William Elsum published in 1934, contains information on the Langhornes and being somewhat rare a copy in good condition can fetch \$600.

Newsflash

Notice has just been received from Hobsons Bay City Council that works are planned at the Homestead.

Council are meeting with Architects to review the building and to draw up proper architectural drawings.

HBCC will commence maintenance /capital works on the Homestead building over May/June/ July 2012 and it is possible the Homestead may need to be closed for approximately one month. Work at the expense of the Council will be carried out in two stages and will include Electrical works,re -sheeting of the roof, and roof insulation.

Stage 2 will include redevelopment of the kitchen and toilet facility and heating will be considered.

Members please Note

We have a small membership base and have achieved a number of goals over the past eighteen months however there is an increasing need for all members to assist in the continuation of a number of projects, archiving of items and cataloguing material into our database continues, but with the development of our web site underway we envisage a growth in enquiries and the receipt of more information.

Members are requested to assist wherever possible by attending on open days whenever possible, helping out at upcoming events, especially major event days such as Australia Day and the Beach Festival.

Additional attendance on open days for example Tuesdays or the first Sunday of the month will allow the regular members who always attend some assistance and perhaps some well earned time off.

Assistance with identifying individuals in photos, or events depicted will be of great assistance so that they may be recorded into our database and will become searchable by persons wishing to research particular groups or individuals.

For example school or sporting photos with individuals correctly identified could be collated and form the basis of a future web site depiction or perhaps booklet of interest to those involved with the groups as well as the general public.

Because of the expected workload there will not be a General Meeting every month for the period January to June 2012.

It is planned that General Meetings on the third Tuesday will be held in February, April and June 2012, and it is expected that members will assist at the open days and special events outlined above.

A basic program is outlined overleaf, but this may be varied due to the recently announced redevelopment works planned for mid 2012.

Our Database

We have mentioned or Catalogue Database that is being collated by members and volunteers but from this has grown the concept and the ability to enter photographs of individuals, team and group photos which can be searched by individual name or key words enabling for all photos to be listed which contain that individual's name or the key world involved.

This will allow for a search to find all photos of a specific nature, this is of particular benefit for those wishing to isolate school or sporting photos containing a person of specific interest.

This section of the database is its early stages of development and as indicated earlier in this newsletter members can be of great assistance in obtaining group photos for cataloguing or assisting in identifying individuals in photos that are already in the Society archives.

5.	General Business Reports The President, Peter Weaver reported on a number of matters: The Council is considering quotes to make improvements to the Homestead including the addition of a kitchen area. Audio Screens have been purchased and are installed and working. A computer has been purchased and is being used for the general archiving of objects into the database. Cabinets have been sourced from Laverton and some showcases have been relocated to Truganina. A vacuum cleaner has been purchased for use around the Homestead, and a Christmas tree will be installed for the Christmas period. He advised that on this day, 41 people had visited the Homestead as a group, and 15 books were sold. Lantern Tours also continue to pay a fee for the use of the Homestead for their Ghost Tour events.	

Bob Hawkins as a delegate and on behalf of the second delegate Margaret Rice presented a detailed report into the meeting of the Western Metropolitan Group of Historical Societies that was held on the 12th November 2011, he reported to them the activities of the ALHS and advised members in attendance of the current activities of other member Historical Societies Broadmeadows, Craigieburn, Keilor, St Albans, Sunshine, Werribee and the TAA Museum. A full written report was tabled and is available for members to read in the Society archives if required. Bob Hawkins also reported on TERPS, and matters under consideration by their group include landscaping of the area near the building, and research being made into the Maritime History around the site and the movement of explosives to and from the premises. General matters regarding the WMGH Society were discussed including the attendance of new groups from St Albans and Broadmeadows. Bob also detailed his activities on behalf of the Society over the past twelve months which includes various talks given on aircraft history to persons at the Altona Library, Moorabbin Air Museum, Laverton and Point Cook Rotary Clubs, Probus Clubs and the like. He also advised that he is developing a chronology and dates of activities of the Langhorne's that are contained within the Langhorne Family book. Elaine Brogan reported on the WMGH Group and the activities of the Friends of the Light Horse, and advised that Flowers of Remembrance were laid in commemoration of military activities. She also reported that the Living Museum of the West is struggling to continue its activities, and that Parks Victoria are seeking continued activity on the site occupied by them. Peter Weaver - advised that Honour Boards have been updated, and Life Member Boards are in the process of being updated. Carols by Candlelight is to be supported and the Homestead will be open on the evening of the 11th December between 6 p.m and 8 p.m. prior to the event. Judith Kirkman advised that the web site (alhs.com.au) is nearing completion and encourages the development of information from local groups to place details of their History onto the web. AnnCassar spoke of attending the Significance Assessment Workshop a 3-day event in Canberra, on behalf of the Society and she will supply a report for inclusion in the December newsletter.
